WTO NATIONAL SEMINAR ON AGREEMENT ON TRADE-RELATED ASPECTS OF INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS (TRIPS) AND CONTEMPORARY POLICY ISSUES

1. Introduction

The WTO National Seminar will focus on the Agreement on Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights (TRIPS) and its implications for policy development, particularly for Least Developed Countries (LDCs) and those approaching LDC graduation. The TRIPS Agreement sets international standards for the protection and enforcement of intellectual property rights (IPRs), covering patents, copyrights, trademarks, and other IP areas. It aims to balance the rights of IP holders with the need for access to essential goods and technologies.

For LDCs, the TRIPS Agreement presents both opportunities and challenges. While it provides a framework for improving IP protection and fostering innovation, it also imposes obligations that may strain the resources and capacities of these countries. The transition from LDC status to a developing country status involves increased compliance with TRIPS provisions, which can impact national policies on public health, technology transfer, and industrial development. The seminar will address these dynamics, exploring how LDCs can navigate the challenges of TRIPS obligations and leverage them for sustainable development, particularly in areas such as climate change adaptation technologies. The workshop will feature expert lectures, interactive discussions, and case studies to help officials better understand and implement TRIPS in the context of their specific national challenges and opportunities.

2. Objectives

The major objectives of the National Seminar are listed below:

- 1. To improve government officials' capacity to analyze policy choices related to TRIPS.
- 2. To address multidisciplinary issues and foster effective domestic coordination in implementing TRIPS.
- 3. To enhance understanding of policy issues concerning public health and technology transfer.
- 4. To examine challenges and lessons learned from technology transfer, including climate change and adaptation technologies.
- 5. To provide a platform for interactive discussions and knowledge sharing among participants.

3. Expected Outcomes

- i. Enhanced ability of government officials to implement and navigate the TRIPS Agreement.
- ii. Improved understanding of the intersection between TRIPS and policy areas such as public health and technology transfer.

- iii. Greater insight into challenges and best practices related to technology transfer and adaptation technologies.
- iv. Strengthened coordination and policy analysis capacities among officials involved in IPR-related issues.
