GENERAL DESCRIPTION AND TARGET

Administrative Law is going through a series of deep transformations, which challenge its traditional approach and pose interesting practical questions. Perhaps the most curious of them is the jump of the discipline to the transnational sphere, allowing the existence of what from an orthodox perspective could be considered a paradox: Administrative Law beyond the State. This new perspective sheds different lights on the classical contents of the subject: the sources of law, public procurement, the responsibility of the State and the law of civil servants. The main objective of this summer course is to serve as a space of dialogue between professors —national and international—, students and general public, in which the current transformations can be discussed through a Global Administrative Law approach.
