4th WHO-WIPO-WTO Trilateral Workshop Technology Transfer from the Perspectives of Practitioners

Objectives

The workshop, jointly organized by the Secretariats of the WHO, WIPO and the WTO, will draw from the experience and perspectives of practitioners working on the ground. The objectives are as follows:

- Strengthen the capacity of policymakers and experts in member governments to understand the process of technology transfer in the area of health technologies in order to ensure better response and preparedness to future pandemics;
- Foster a better understanding of intellectual property and trade to promote technology transfer, and examine the role of licensing and financing as part of the ecosystem for innovation, local production and access to health technologies.
- Provide a forum for the exchange of experiences and views that can help the Secretariats
 of the WHO, WIPO and the WTO to better respond to the capacity-building needs of their
 members and WTO accession candidates.

The significant role of technology transfer beyond COVID-19

Technology transfer is a collaborative and practical process connecting various actors of the innovation ecosystem to move towards common public health goals. The experience gained from the COVID-19 pandemic gave rise to great interest in technology transfer with a view to scaling up and diversifying manufacturing capacity to ensure timely, global, and equitable access to medical technologies. Their geographically diverse production requires a fertile ecosystem, where the transfer of technology, knowledge, know-how, and data can take place smoothly and regularly, as new technologies emerge.

Experience and best practices in the technology transfer ecosystem are rapidly evolving; and up-to-date information is not always readily available. The technical workshop will bring together experts working directly on IP, licensing and financing to draw from their practical experience. In view of recent efforts to bolster manufacturing particularly in LMICs, this workshop aims to address technology transfer issues experienced by practitioners in the field, as well as to explore innovative measures and incentives to support technology transfer.
